Eligibility Requirements and Criteria

Nationality Requirements	<p>Applicants must be foreign nationals whose both parents are also foreign nationals. (Applicants cannot apply if either the applicant or one of the parents holds Korean nationality.)</p>	<p>A foreign national refers to a person who does not possess South Korean citizenship. Dual citizenship holders are not recognized as foreign applicants. If dual nationality is discovered at any time, admission will be canceled—even after enrollment.</p>
Academic Requirements	<p>Applicants must have completed at least 12 years of primary and secondary education, either in Korea or abroad, and have graduated (or be expected to graduate) from high school, or hold an equivalent academic qualification.</p>	<p>In overseas education systems:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grades 1–6 are considered elementary school, • Grades 7–9 as middle school, • Grades 10–12 as high school.
Language Proficiency Requirements	<p>IELTS 5.5 or above, or TOEFL iBT 71 or above (for English track applicants)</p>	
Completion of Full Curriculum Abroad	<p>Applicants must have completed the entire curriculum equivalent to Korea’s elementary, middle, and high school education. B. Criteria for Eligibility Recognition

(1) Nationality Recognition

- A foreigner is defined as an individual **who does not possess Korean nationality**
- **Dual nationality holders are not considered foreigners** and are **not eligible** to apply.

(2) Recognition of Foreign Educational Institutions

- Recognized schools must be located **outside of Korea**.
(Foreign schools located within Korea are **not recognized** as foreign institutions.)
- Only **regular educational institutions officially recognized** by the local government under the laws of the relevant country will be accepted. Programs such as **language training, foundation courses, adult education, distance learning, or online courses** are **excluded** from eligibility.

※ General Guidelines

1. **All academic documents** issued by foreign schools (e.g., graduation certificates, transcripts, etc.) must be submitted with either:
 - an **Apostille Certificate** issued by a designated government agency in the country where the school is located, or
 - a **Certificate of Verification for Overseas Educational Institutions** or **Consular Confirmation** issued by the Korean Embassy or Consulate in that country.

※ Apostille certificates must be issued by institutions designated by the respective national government (e.g., in Korea, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs).

2. Any documents written in a language other than Korean or English **must be accompanied by a notarized Korean or English translation.**
 3. If the submitted documents are insufficient to verify the applicant's qualifications, the university may request **additional documentation.**
 4. **Health insurance or international student insurance is mandatory** for all admitted students.
 5. **Submitted documents will not be returned** under any circumstances.

1. Financial Sponsorship Documents

- **Applicants residing outside of Korea** must submit a **bank balance certificate showing a minimum of USD 18,000** under the sponsor's name.
- **Applicants residing in Korea** must submit a **bank balance certificate showing a minimum of USD 9,000** under the sponsor's name.

※ Notes on Bank Balance Certificates:

- Submit **copies of both the front and back pages of the bankbook** (showing the most recent deposit amount), along with the certificate.
- The bank balance certificate must be **issued using the official form provided by the bank**, and it must include the bank's **contact information**.
- The deposit must be under the name of either the applicant or the financial sponsor.
- The funds must have been **continuously held for at least one month**; alternatively, a **remittance certificate or currency exchange confirmation** may be submitted.

IV. How to Apply

1. All application information must be **completed by the applicant in Korean**.
2. During the application period, applicants may **submit their documents in advance for a preliminary eligibility review**.
3. All required documents must be **submitted within the designated application period**.
4. Once submitted, **applications cannot be withdrawn or modified**, and **submitted documents will not be returned**.

- Applicants must submit academic documents (e.g., certificate of (expected) graduation, transcripts) issued by foreign institutions with either:

- An **Apostille Certificate** issued by a designated authority in the country where the school is located, or
- A **Certificate of Verification** or **Consular Confirmation** issued by the Korean consulate in the country where the school is located.

- Apostille certificates must be issued by organizations designated by the national government (e.g., Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Korea)

- Any documents in languages other than Korean or English must be accompanied by a **notarized Korean or English translation**.

- If the authenticity of submitted documents is unclear, **additional documentation may be requested**.

VII. Important Notes for Applicants

1. Applicants must thoroughly review and understand the contents of this admissions guide to avoid any mistakes during the application and screening process.

The university will not be held responsible for any disadvantages caused by the applicant's oversight or misunderstanding.

All applicants must strictly follow the official procedures set by the university.

2. The following individuals may have their admission **revoked at any time**, regardless of the admissions officer's negligence, and whether before or after enrollment, even after graduation:
 - Those who do not meet the eligibility requirements
 - Those who fail to graduate within the academic year despite being admitted as expected graduates
 - Those who provide **false, omitted, forged, or altered information** on the application
 - Those who fail to submit required documents
3. Applicants who **cheat during the interview**, fail the interview, or **do not attend the interview at all** will be **excluded from final selection**.
4. Applicants who are determined to **lack sufficient Korean language ability** or academic preparedness based on the screening results may be rejected.

5. **Admission scores will not be disclosed** under any circumstances.
6. If an accepted applicant fails to pay the tuition within the designated period, the **admission offer will be canceled**.
In unavoidable cases, the university may extend the registration period.
7. Applicants must ensure they are reachable at all times. The university is **not responsible for any disadvantages due to loss of contact**.
8. If a **visa is denied**, the admission offer may be revoked.
9. By submitting the application form, the applicant is deemed to have **agreed** to the use of their personal information for purposes such as:
educational administration, admissions management, academic affairs, verifying academic records with previous schools (including universities), statistics, and promotional activities.
10. Any other matters not specified in this guide shall be handled in accordance with the university's internal policies and regulations.
